ICD-10 ESSENTIALS for ABDOMEN and PELVIS

The following elements are essential for the proper ICD-10-CM coding of conditions found in the **Abdomen and Pelvis**:

PEPTIC ULCERS

- Location
- Acute vs. Chronic
- Complication

DIVERTICULAR DISEASE

- Location
- Complication

CROHN'S DISEASE

- Location
- Complication

ULCERATIVE COLITIS

- Location
- Complication

HYDRONEPHROSIS

- Type
- Underlying condition

Common Abdomen/Pelvis Diagnoses	ICD-10 Specificity Guidance
Abdominal Pain	 Location (Localized vs. Generalized), Quadrant, Area Type (Pain, Tenderness, Rebound)
Calculus of Kidney	 Distinguish between Kidney and/or Ureter
Pelvic Pain	Location
Gallstones	 Distinguish if with Cholecystitis Distinguish if with Obstruction Acute vs. Chronic Bile Duct vs. Gallbladder
Ovarian Cyst(s)	 Specific Type (i.e., Follicular, Corpus Luteum, Simple, Retention)

Peptic Ulcers

Peptic ulcers, in ICD-10, will no longer require documentation of obstruction. However, documentation requirements will include location, whether the ulcer is acute or chronic, and any complications that may exist:

Unspecified Example:	Specified Example:

Indication: **gastric ulcer**Coded as: *gastric ulcer*, *unspecified* as acute

or chronic, without hemorrhage

or perforation

Indication: acute bleeding gastric ulcer

Coded as: acute gastric ulcer with

hemorrhage

Diverticular Disease

Diverticular disease (**diverticulosis**, **diverticulitis**) classifications are expanded in ICD-10 and require documentation of location and complications:

Location	Complication
Small Intestine	Bleeding
Large Intestine	Perforation
Small & Large Intestine	Abscess
Unspecified

Crohn's Disease

Crohn's disease classifications are expanded in ICD-10 and require documentation of location and complications:

Location	Complication
Small Intestine	Rectal Bleeding
Large Intestine	Intestinal Obstruction
Small & Large Intestine	Fistula
Unspecified	Abscess

Coded as: Crohn's disease, unspecified, Coded as: Crohn's disease of small intestine

Ulcerative Colitis

Ulcerative colitis disease classifications are expanded in ICD-10 and require documentation of location and complications:

Location	Complication
Left Sided Colitis	Rectal Bleeding
Rectosigmoiditis	Intestinal Obstruction
Pancolitis	Fistula
Proctitis	Abscess
Colon

Hydronephrosis

Hydronephrosis disease classifications are expanded in ICD-10 and require documentation of type of hydronephrosis and underlying conditions:

Туре	Underlying Condition
Acquired (default)	With infection
Congenital	Ureteral stricture
Tuberculous	Obstruction due to renal and/or ureteral calculus
	UPJ obstruction

Indication: hydronephrosis
Coded as: unspecified hydronephrosis

Coded as: hydronephrosis with renal and ureteral calculus obstruction
